

NORTH EAST TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS
MEETING
MONDAY, OCTOBER 17, 2016
9:00 AM

Chairman August Neff called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Also in attendance Supervisors Fredrick Shunk and Robert Mazza, Attorney Robert Jeffery and Secretary Karen Ahlgrim. Members of the public included Kurt Lichtenfeld, Jim Williams, Ann Kreider, Bill Heald, Aime Szymanski and Matt Putman.

Chairman Neff asked for public comments or concerns and none were received. A motion from Fredrick Shunk and the second from Robert Mazza approved the minutes of the October 3, 2016 meeting as presented and passed by unanimous vote. Bills were presented for October 1st through October 16th, 2016 for approval and payment as follows:

Total approved by a motion from Fredrick Shunk and the second from Robert Mazza was \$247,845.03 and passed by unanimous vote.

Correspondence:

Supervisors acknowledged receipt of an announcement from the Erie County Conservation District opening the Dirt & Gravel Road and the Low Volume Road grant funding for 2017. We participated this year with the Dirt & Gravel work on South Hammond and will most likely look into the Low Volume program for 2017.

An invitation to Supervisors was received from the Crescent Hose Company for their annual dinner dance on November 19th at the Harborcreek Moose Club. Interested Supervisors should let the secretary know by November 5th.

Old Business:

A seasonal reminder of Ordinance #2014-002, regulating parking of vehicles along roadways between October 15 and March 31 each year for snow removal was addressed by August Neff.

New Business:

Mr. Dan Laughlin, candidate for Senator, 49th District stopped in to introduce himself, he noted the reason he is running for this office is because he feels Harrisburg needs more common sense, less red tape. He has been a home builder for many years in our area.

Attorney Jeffery and Fredrick Shunk noted a developer's agreement is being worked on for a sewer line on West Law Road, they are now awaiting DEP approval to take the line from Ed Sveda's residence west, and previously DEP wanted that extension to go to 12 Mile Creek. Supervisors decided to table this item until a response comes from DEP.

Kurt Lichtenfeld asked the Supervisors to consider hiring a grant writer for the Township; he feels that there is money out there to apply for. Jim Williams noted that we should call Penn State; we might be able to contract with them.

August Neff noted that South Hammond Road will be seal coated on Tuesday, the 18th and that the Conservation Park fishing access pathway will be starting on October 24th but will not close off the path totally for residents.

After announcements a motion to adjourn at 9:15 am was received from Fredrick Shunk and the second from Robert Mazza. Meeting adjourned.
